Dr. Kenneth Aschheim has more than 30 years of private practice experience in all aspects of cosmetic and restorative dentistry. He has lectured and conducted workshops throughout the world and has been a contributor to the dental literature. In 2015, the third edition of his textbook, Esthetic Dentistry: A Clinical Approach to Techniques and Materials (Elsevier), which include the latest esthetic and advanced technologies, was published. He has also consulted throughout the world to numerous government agencies as well as the National institute of Science and Technology (NIST) where, in 2015, he became a member of the Crime Scene and Death Investigation Subcommittee of the Organization of Scientific Area Committees for Forensic Science. Dr. Aschheim has also served as a consultant to numerous dental companies on various dental and computer technologies. He has been a member of the NYSDA Information Technology Committee since 2013.
