Do you maintain and transmit patient health records electronically? Do you issue prescriptions electronically? If so, you are subject to the HIPAA Security Regulations. Violations of these regulations or security breaches can result in large fines against you.

The course and the accompanying *NYSDA HIPAA Security Compliance Manual* provide a practical guide for dentists and their office team. It is a hands-on workshop where you will learn how to complete the documentation necessary to help avoid sanctions in the event of a government audit or breach of your patient's data.

The course was developed by NYSDA's Information Technology Committee to help member-dentists comply with federal HIPAA laws and avoid punitive sanctions. It provides great recommendations for best practices to avoid unwanted breaches of your patient's protected health information. The course also answers many frequently asked questions about maintaining and transmitting protected patient information in the dental office, including:

- What does the law require?
- Who should have access to the dental office's Wi-Fi?
- What is encryption? Is it required?
- Can x-rays be transmitted via email? To patients? To other doctors?
- What are the real risks? How can office data be breached?
- How can a dental practice protect itself from a security breach? What must a practice do if its computers are breached?
- When are "Business Associate Agreements" required?

This course is designed to educate the entire dental office team. Dentists are encouraged to bring their team. Attendees will receive 3 MCE credit hours.
